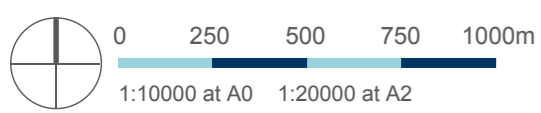

# HERITAGE

## WESTERN GEELONG GROWTH AREA

- The identification and protection of heritage places within the growth areas will allow for local character to be incorporated into the future urban landscape and within the open space network.

### Aboriginal Cultural Heritage

A total of thirty-three registered Aboriginal places were identified in the study area.

High Aboriginal archaeological potential areas:

- Moorabool River, Barwon River and Cowies Creek are all identified as areas of Aboriginal cultural heritage sensitivity.

Moderate Aboriginal archaeological potential areas:

- The crest of the escarpment, overlooking Barwon River
- Small hill crest, north of Barwon River, overlooking the floodplain
- Margins of two small waterways, north of Hamilton Highway and Fyansford-Gheringhap Road
- The crest of the escarpment, overlooking Moorabool River
- A small hill/knoll between Batesford and Moorabool River to the south

Low Aboriginal archaeological potential areas:

- All other areas demonstrate low archaeological sensitivity
- Limited investigations have been undertaken to date and there are likely to be more Aboriginal archaeological sites in the study area.

### Post-Contact Cultural Heritage

A total of fifteen registered heritage places were found in the study area.

Three places of State significance that are listed on the Victorian Heritage Register:

- Former Travellers Rest Inn, 750 Midland Highway
- Frogmore, 425-465 Hamilton Highway
- Bridge over Moorabool River, Batesford

Two archaeological places were identified and were formerly listed on the Victorian Heritage Inventory

- Elevated conveyor, Geelong Cement Works, Batesford Quarry
- Hawthorn Hedge, Creamery Road, 110 Creamery Road, Batesford

Ten places listed on the local Heritage Overlay, three of which are also listed on the National Trust Register.

- Please refer to map for local heritage overlay sites.

Places of potential heritage values:

- Dry stone walls along Friend-in-Hand Road
- Three walls in Batesford along Old Ballarat Road and along Cross Street
- Dryden Homestead, 200 McCanns Lane, Fyansford
