How to prepare before an emergency

Know where you and your pet can go in an emergency. Not all Emergency Evacuation Centres can accommodate pets.

Know who you'll call to check on your pet if you can't.

Identify your pet with a microchip, ID tag and/or pet registration tag in case you become separated.

Assemble an emergency kit for your pet.

What to do during an emergency

- ✓ Stay informed of the situation.
- ✓ Bring your pet inside.
- ✓ Regularly check on your pet and ensure they have access to water.
- ✓ Separate children and pets as emergencies can be stressful.
- ✓ Review your plan.
- ✓ If you decide to leave, leave early and don't forget your pet!

Emergency preparedness checklist for your pet

Food and water.

Medication, pet health record and vet contact details.

First aid supplies.

Lead, harness, crate or pet carrier.

Toy and/or treats.

Poo bags, litter tray or other waste removal tools.

Pet bed, blanket or towels for comfort.
